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PRESENTATION

The Superintendence of Transportation, through the Delegate of Ports, presents the Statistical Bulletin of port traffic in Colombia from January to December 2020, which contains information on the cargo of goods that enter, leave and transit through of the different port zones and port companies of public and private service in Colombia, as well as the cabotage and river cargo that moves between the different ports of the country. To observe the behavior and evolution of the port traffic cargo in the country, the analysis is presented regarding the variation of the figures from January to December of the year 2020 with respect to the same period of the years 2019 and 2018, said analysis is carried out through all the chapters.

The importance of the types of cargo handled through Colombian ports, their behavior and their evolution in the last three years, is also presented in this bulletin the graphs and tables that consolidate the information to a breakdown of port zone and society port, with special emphasis on the cargo handled by regional port companies and the comparison between public and private port companies.

The chapter on containers shows their evolution over time, presenting the data in units of TEUS and FEUS, their behavior and the share that each port society represents compared to the total mobilized.

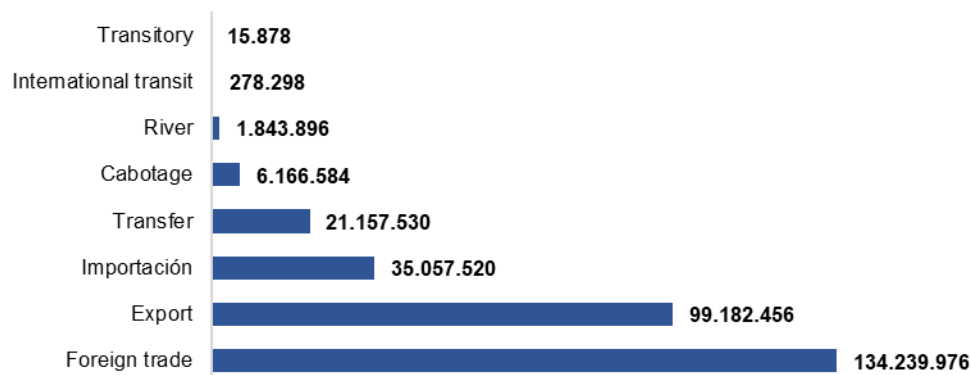

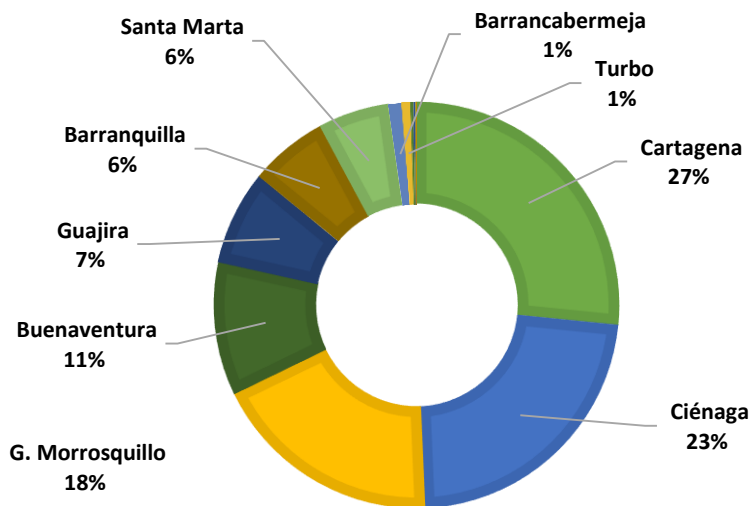

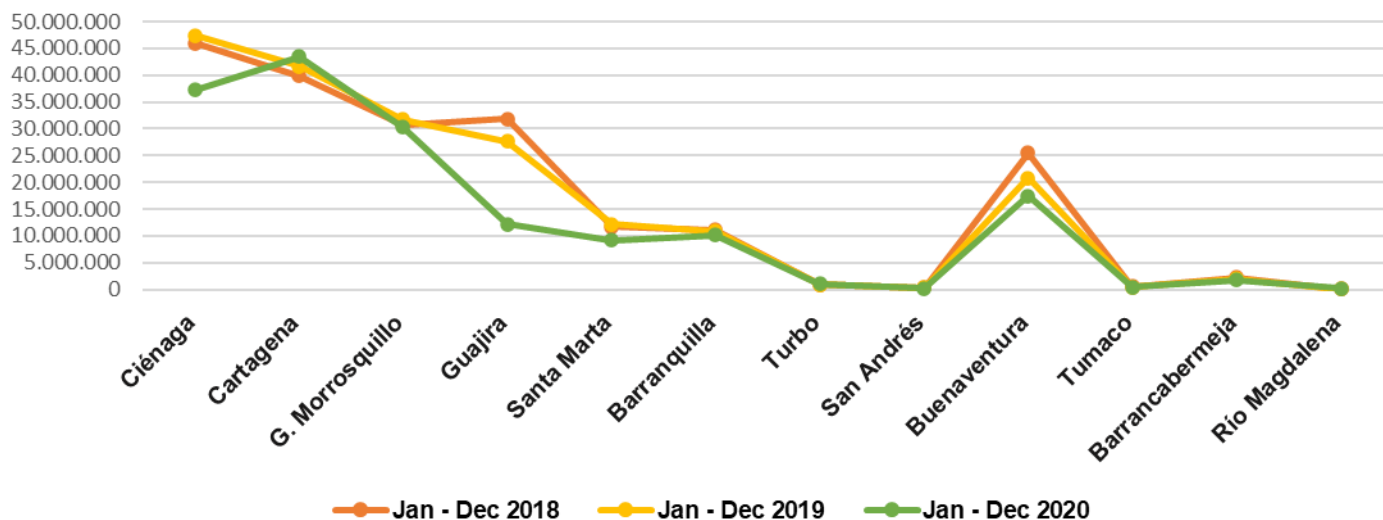

During the period from January to December 2020, the port zones handled a total of 163.7 million tons, registering a negative variation of 17%, which is equivalent to 32.5 million tons less in relation to the same period of 2019. This decrease was due to mainly to lower volumes of cargo mobilized in the coal product in the port zones of Guajira and Ciénaga.

The Caribbean region mobilized 143.9 million tons for 2020, with a participation of 88%, presenting a negative variation of 17% compared to the previous year. Likewise, the Pacific region mobilized 17.7 million tons, presenting a decrease of 16%.

The port zone of Cartagena had the highest participation in port traffic, with 43.5 million tons mobilized, a participation of 27% of the total and a growth of 4% compared to the previous year.

The second port zone with the highest participation in cargo movement was Ciénaga, participating with 23% of the total, which corresponds to 37.2 million tons and a decrease of 22% compared to 2019, due to the reduction in movement of products such as coal.

In third place, with a 19% share of the total, the port zone of the Gulf of Morrosquillo, which handled a total 30.2 million tons of cargo, with a decrease of 5% compared to 2019, due to the decrease in the movement of products such as hydrocarbons.

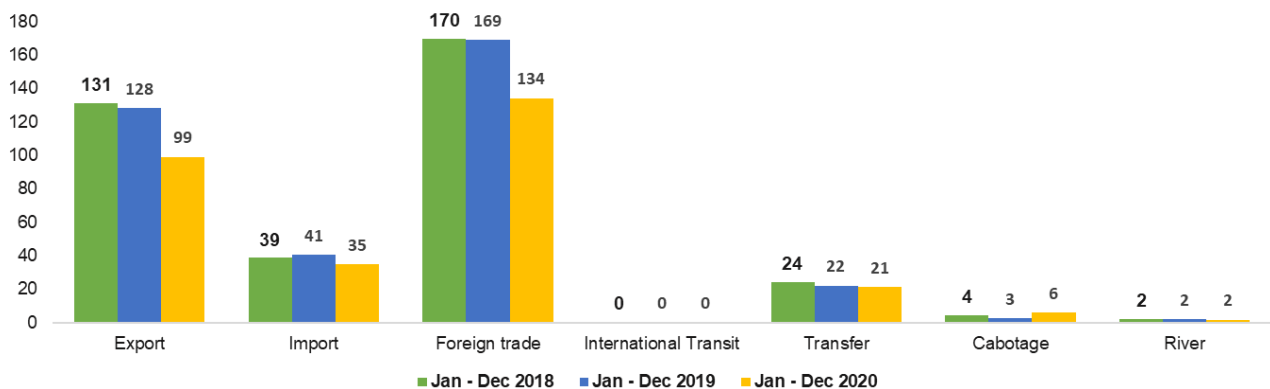

Regarding the foreign trade cargo (export and import), there is a 23% decrease in exports compared to 2019 and a 14% decrease in imported cargo respectively. This is due to the decrease in exports and imports through the port zones of Guajira, Santa Marta and Ciénaga.

The transshipment cargo registered a negative variation of 5%, going from moving 22.2 million tons in 2019, to 21.1 million tons in 2020, that is, 1 million tons less than the previous year, being registered mostly by the port zones of Buenaventura and Santa Marta. Cabotage cargo reflects a positive variation of 126% compared to 2019, equivalent to 3.4 million tons more than the previous year, mainly in the port zone of Buenaventura, Cartagena and Santa Marta.

River traffic, showed a decrease of 13% due to the low mobilization of liquid bulk and general cargo in the port zone of Barrancabermeja.

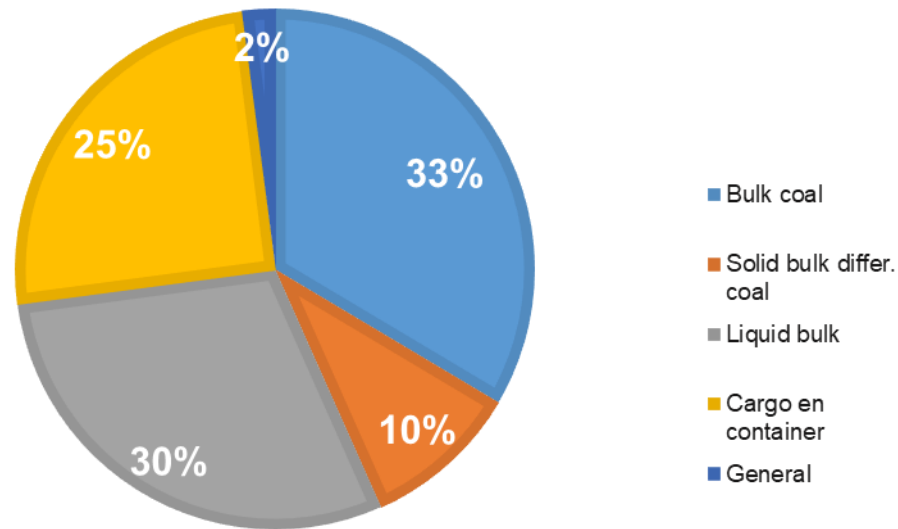

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In terms of cargo volume, bulk coal is the most important type of cargo, registering a volume of 54.8 million tons and a 33% share of the total mobilized, mostly by the Caribbean region, mainly in the zones ports of Ciénaga and Guajira.

In second place, there is liquid bulk (mainly hydrocarbon) with 48.4 million tons and a 30% share of the total cargo handled, mainly by the Caribbean region in the port zones of G. Morrosquillo and Cartagena.

Third, containerized cargo with 41.1 million tons moved in 2020, with a 25% share of the total cargo handled by the port zones of Cartagena and Buenaventura.

The port zones of Buenaventura and Barranquilla occupy the first and second place, with a 64% share of solid bulk cargo other than coal. This type of cargo has a participation of 10% with 16 million tons mobilized during 2020.

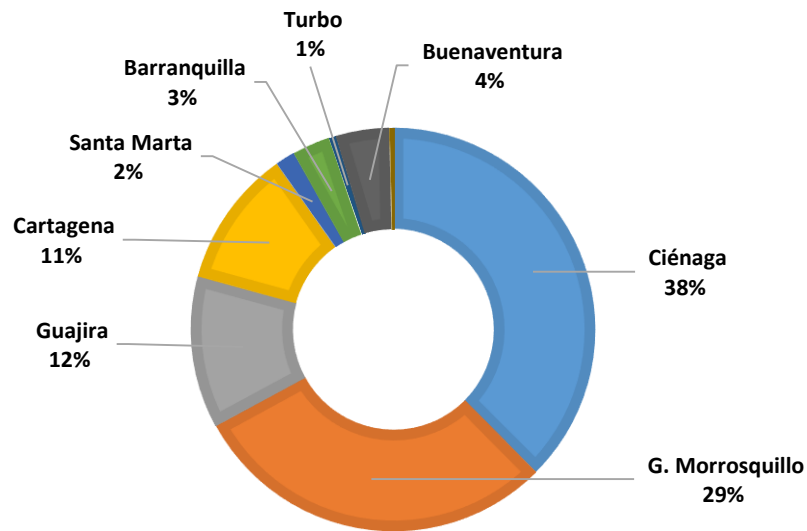
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During 2020, a total of 99.1 million tons were exported, with a decrease of 23% compared to the previous year, which means that 29 million tons were stopped being exported compared to 2019. 96% of the cargo was exported through the Caribbean region, mainly through the port zones of Ciénaga, Golfo de Morrosquillo and La Guajira, which represent 80% of the total cargo exported in 2020.

In the Pacific region, the percentage of participation of the exported cargo registers 5%, mainly by the port zone of Buenaventura.

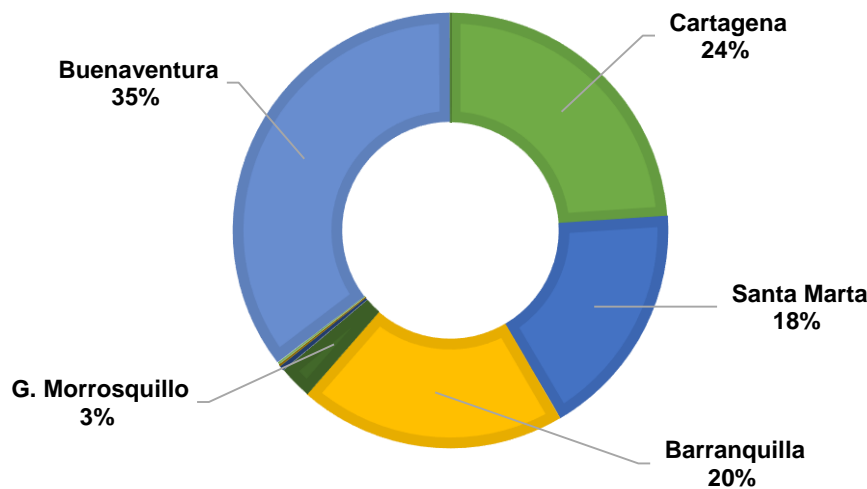

Regarding the cargo that arrived in the country through the port companies, a cargo volume of 35 million tons was registered for 2020, for a decrease of 14%, which represents 5 million tons less than the previous year.



65% of the cargo was imported through the Caribbean region, mainly through the port zones of Cartagena and Barranquilla, which represent 44% of the total imported cargo during 2020.

In the Pacific region, the share of imported cargo registered 35%, mainly from the Buenaventura port zone.

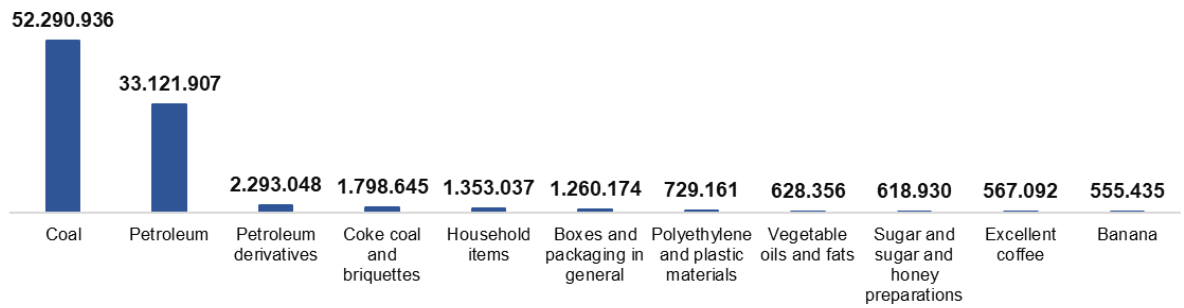

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During 2020, coal and oil cargo were the main exported products, with a significant participation of 86%, compared to the total exported cargo, which corresponds to 85.4 million tons of these two products that left the country mainly for the Caribbean region, mainly through the port zone of Ciénaga, Guajira, Gulf of Morrosquillo, Guajira and Cartagena.

Coal exports represented 53% of the total cargo moved and its main destination countries were Turkey, Panama and the Marshall Islands.

The second line, oil exports represented 33%, registering their departure from the country through the port zones of the Gulf of Morrosquillo and Cartagena, destined mainly for the United States, the Marshall Islands and Liberia.

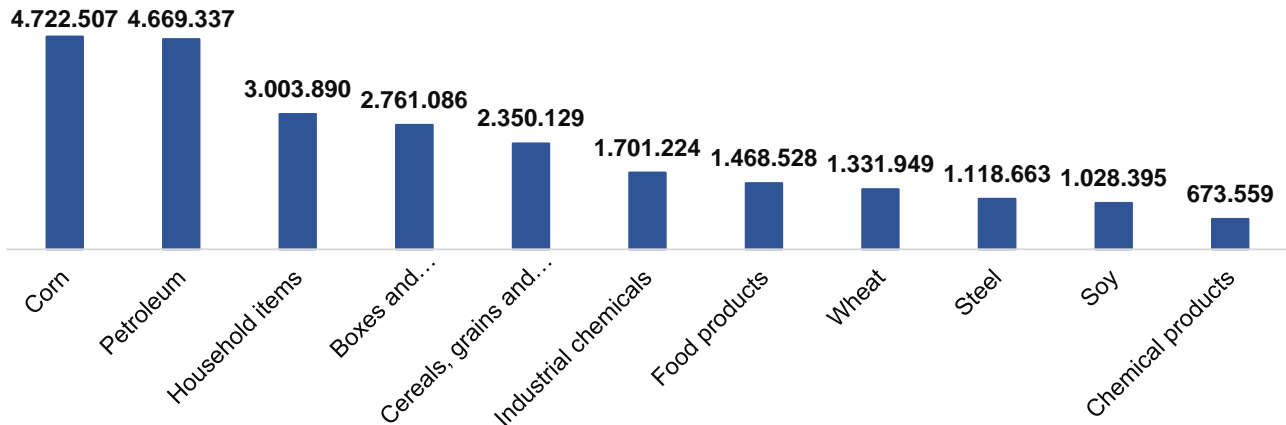

During 2020, oil and corn cargo were the main imported products, with a significant participation of 27%, compared to the total imported cargo, which corresponds to 9.3 million tons of these two products that entered the country mainly through the Caribbean region and specifically the port zone of Santa Marta and Cartagena.

Oil imports represented 13.3% of the total cargo moved and its main countries of origin were the United States and Mexico.

The second line, corn imports represented 13.5% of the total cargo, registering the United States and Brazil as countries of origin.

1.8. ACCUMULATED COMPARISON OF SHIP ARRIVALS BY PORT ZONE

During 2020, port companies recorded a total of 10,596 ship arrivals, with a 12% decrease compared to 2019. In the Caribbean region, 8,359 arrivals were recorded, corresponding to 79% of ships arrived compared to 21 % of total arrivals registered in the Pacific region and Rio Magdalena. For the analysis period, it is determined that an average of 15,449¹ tons were moved per vessel.

The port zones of Barranquilla, Buenaventura and Cartagena registered a decrease in the arrival of ships during 2020, with a negative variation of 10%, 9% and 6% respectively, compared to the previous year.

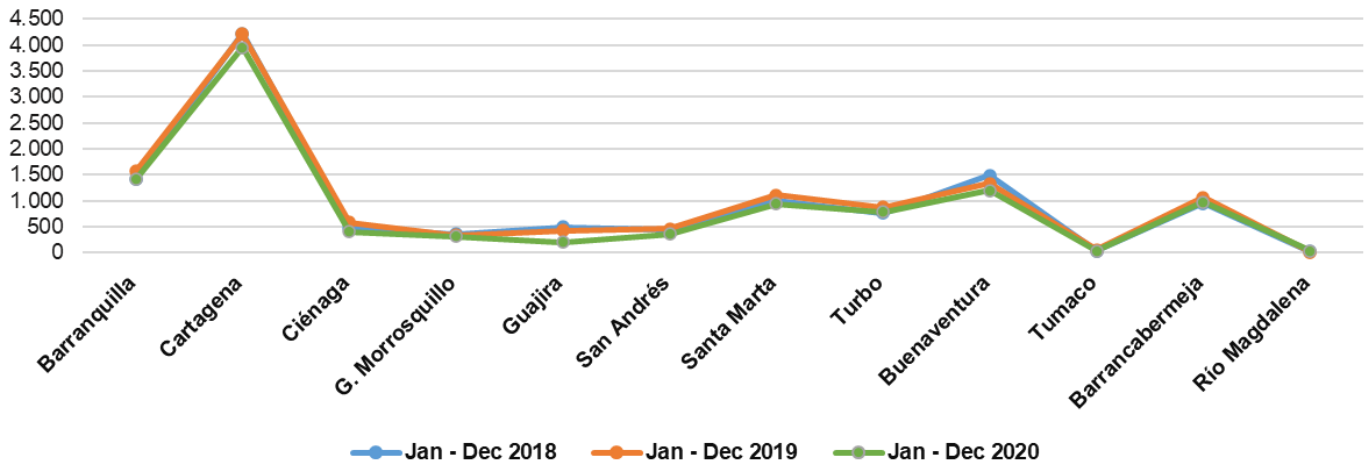

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The movement of cargo for 2020, in public service port companies decreased by 13% compared to 2019. The cargo moved was 99.1 million tons, which reflects a decrease in cargo by 15.4 million tons. The Caribbean region mobilized a total of 80.7 million tons, which translates into an important participation of 81% compared to that mobilized by the public service port companies located in the Pacific region (18%).

Oleoducto Central S.A. and Sociedad Portuaria Terminal de Contenedores de Buenaventura, had a greater participation in cargo movement, with 20% and 21% respectively, which represents 41% of the total and a cargo volume of 40.9 million tons.

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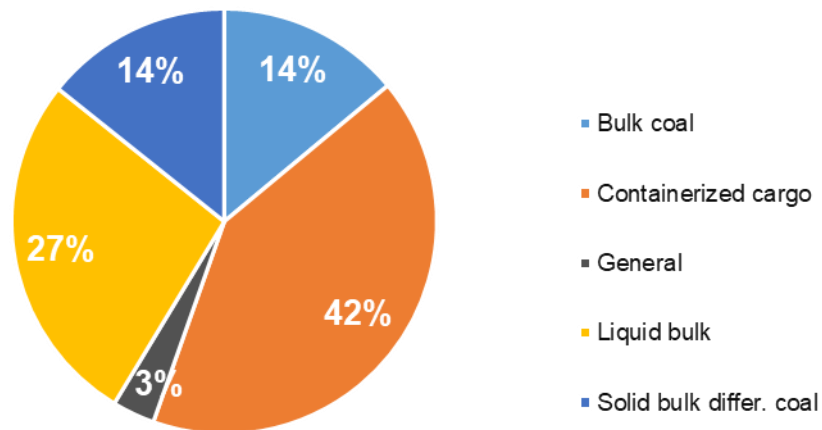
2.3. TYPE OF CARGO MOBILIZED IN PUBLIC SERVICE PORT SOCIETIES

During 2020, containerized cargo registers a greater cargo movement with 30 million tons and a 42% share of the total cargo handled by public service port companies.

Cartagena Container Terminal - Contecar and the Cartagena Regional Port Society were the port companies that handled the most cargo in containers, moving 20.9 and 7.3 million tons respectively, which corresponds to 69% of the total handled by this type of cargo.

It can be seen that liquid bulk and bulk coal represent a participation of 27% and 16% respectively. The port company Oleoducto Central S.A. mobilized 74% of the liquid bulk cargo (hydrocarbons). Regarding the cargo of coal in bulk, the port company Puerto Nuevo S.A., mobilized 7.5 million tons with an important participation of 54% compared to the other port companies that mobilized this type of cargo.

For solid bulk cargo other than coal, it registered a participation of 14%, in the port zones of Buenaventura and Barranquilla.

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The private service port companies mobilized a total of 64.5 million tons for the year 2020, the cargo registered a decrease of 21%, compared to what was mobilized during 2019, which is equivalent to 17 million tons less than the previous year.

The companies, American Port Company and Cerrejón Zona S.A. They are the private service port companies, which registered the highest cargo traffic; with a participation of 46% and 18%, respectively; for a total cargo movement of 41.1 million tons for 64% of all cargo handled by private service port companies during 2020.

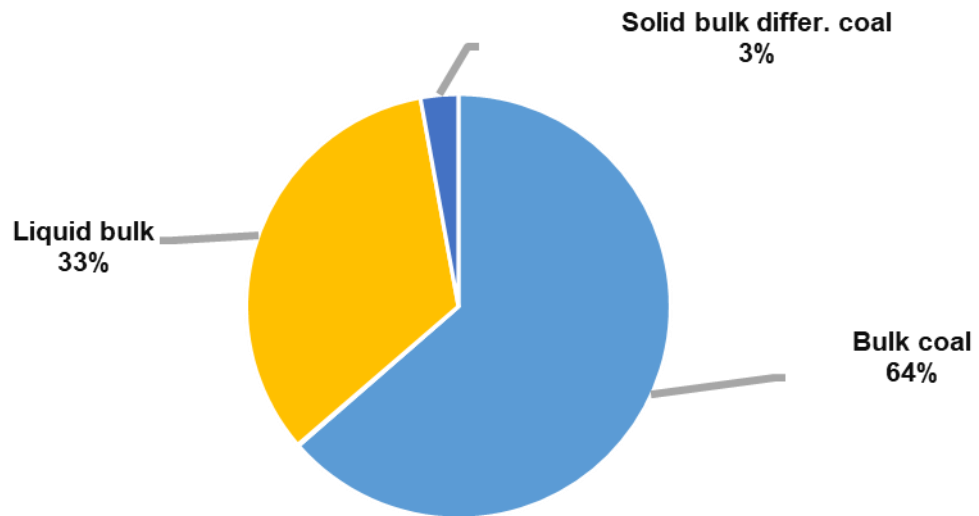

3.3. TYPE OF CARGO MOBILIZED IN PRIVATE SERVICE PORT COMPANIES

The bulk coal cargo registered the highest movement during 2020, mobilized by the private service port companies, with 41 million tons and a 64% share of the total cargo.

In second place, there is liquid bulk with a 33% participation and a cargo movement of 21.5 million tons, for the year 2020.

Cenit SAS - ZP Golfo Morrosquillo and Ecopetrol - ZP Cartagena, were the port companies that mobilized the most cargo of liquid bulk (Hydrocarbon) with a significant participation of 72%, with respect to that mobilized by the private service port companies, with respect to this type loading.

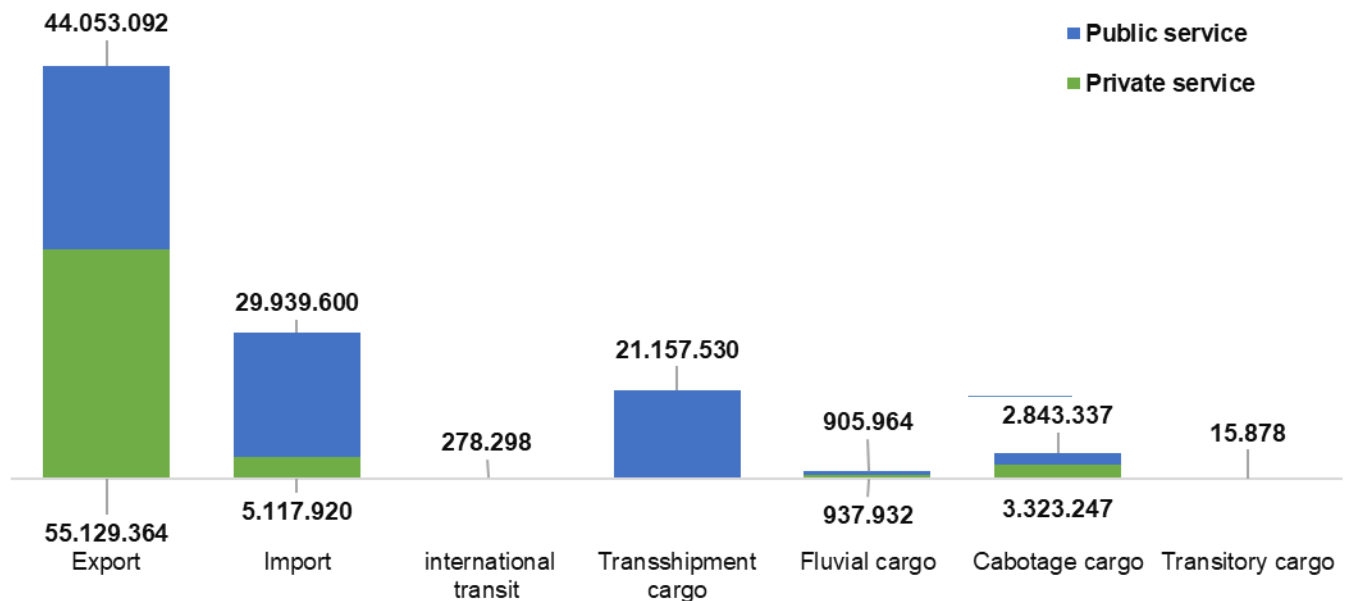

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The private service port companies in 2020 moved 64.5 million tons, with a participation of 39%, with respect to the total cargo moved. Port public service companies handled 99.1 million tons, which means that they had a 61% share of the total handled by all port companies.

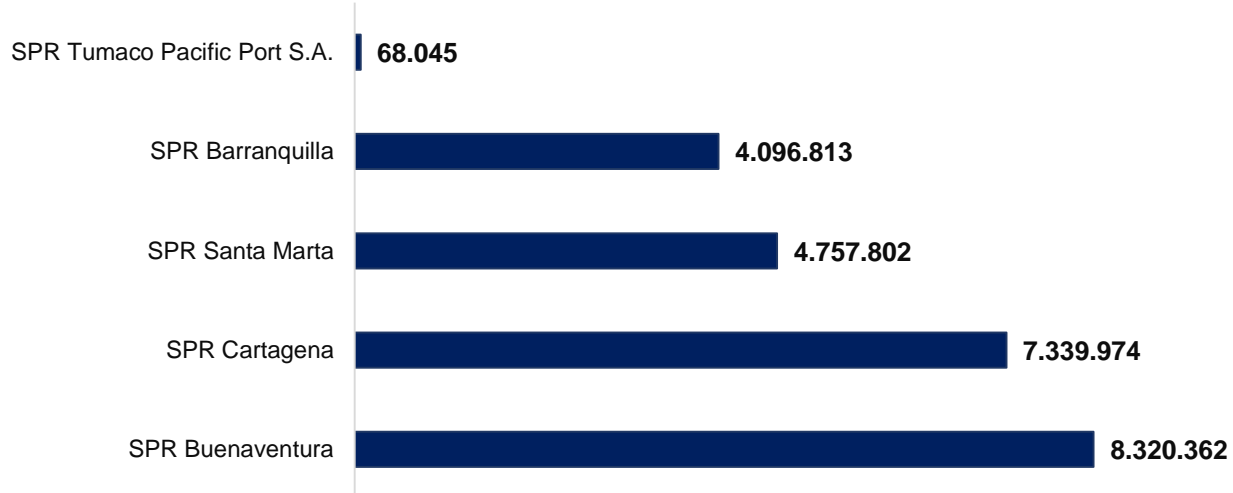

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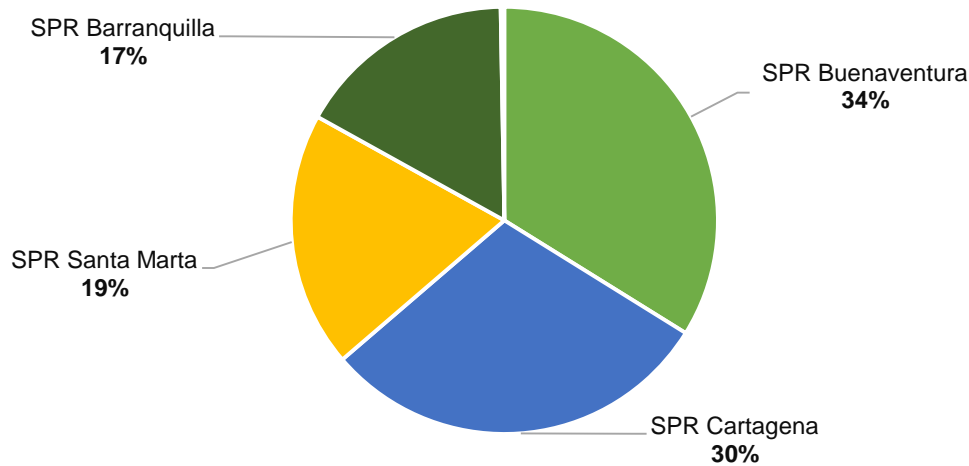
Graph 14. Millions of tons handled by regional port society, January - December (2020)

During 2020, the Buenaventura Regional Port Society was the one with the highest cargo movement with 8.3 million tons, with a significant share of 34% of total cargo traffic compared to the other regional port companies.

It is followed in order by the Regional Port Society of Cartagena, with a 30% participation, registering a cargo movement of 7.3 million tons.

Followed by the Regional Port Society of Santa Marta, with a participation of 19%, registering a cargo movement of 4.7 million tons.

Finally, the regional port companies of Barranquilla and Tumaco registered a movement of 4 million and 68 thousand tons respectively, which is equivalent to a participation of 17% and 0.3%, compared to the total port traffic registered by all the regional port companies.

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The regional port companies during 2020, presented a decrease of 17% in the movement of cargo compared to the previous year. The Tumaco regional port company presented a notorious decrease in its cargo of 40% compared to 2019.

The Regional Port Companies of Buenaventura, Santa Marta and Cartagena, registered during 2020, a participation of 83% with respect to the total cargo handled by this group of port companies.

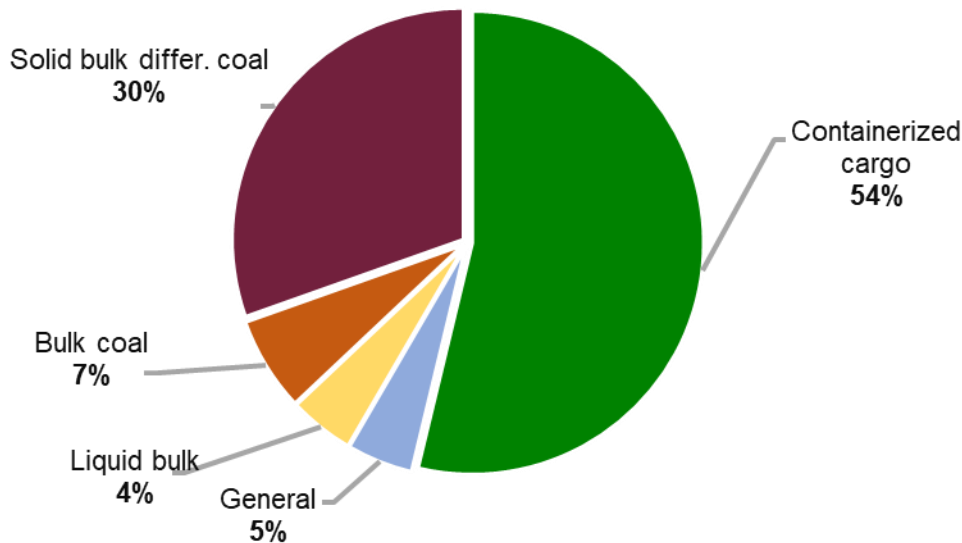

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During 2020, the main type of cargo handled by regional port companies was containerized cargo, for a total of 13.2 million tons, with a significant share of 54%.

Solid bulk other than coal, was in second place, the type of cargo that had the most movement, with a participation of 30.4% of the total (7.4 million tons), registering corn as the main products associated with this type of cargo, where the largest imports are registered from the United States and Brazil.

On the other hand, the coal cargo reflected a movement of 1.6 million tons, which had a 7% share of the total cargo mobilized. The cargo was mobilized mainly through the Santa Marta Regional Port Society, exporting mostly to countries such as Turkey and Guatemala.

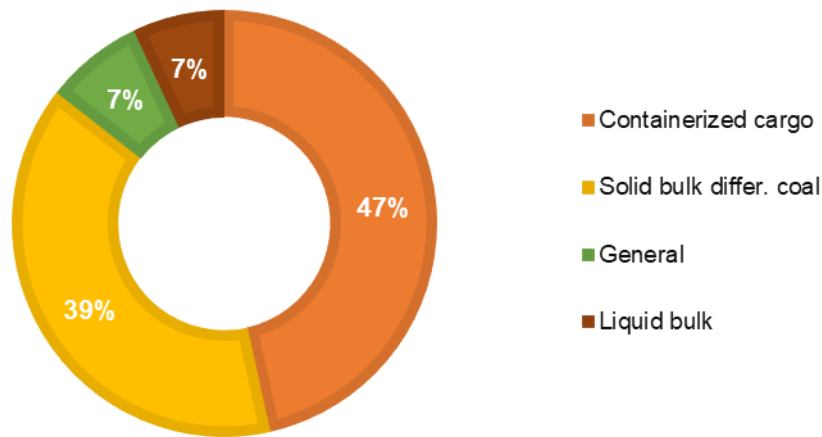

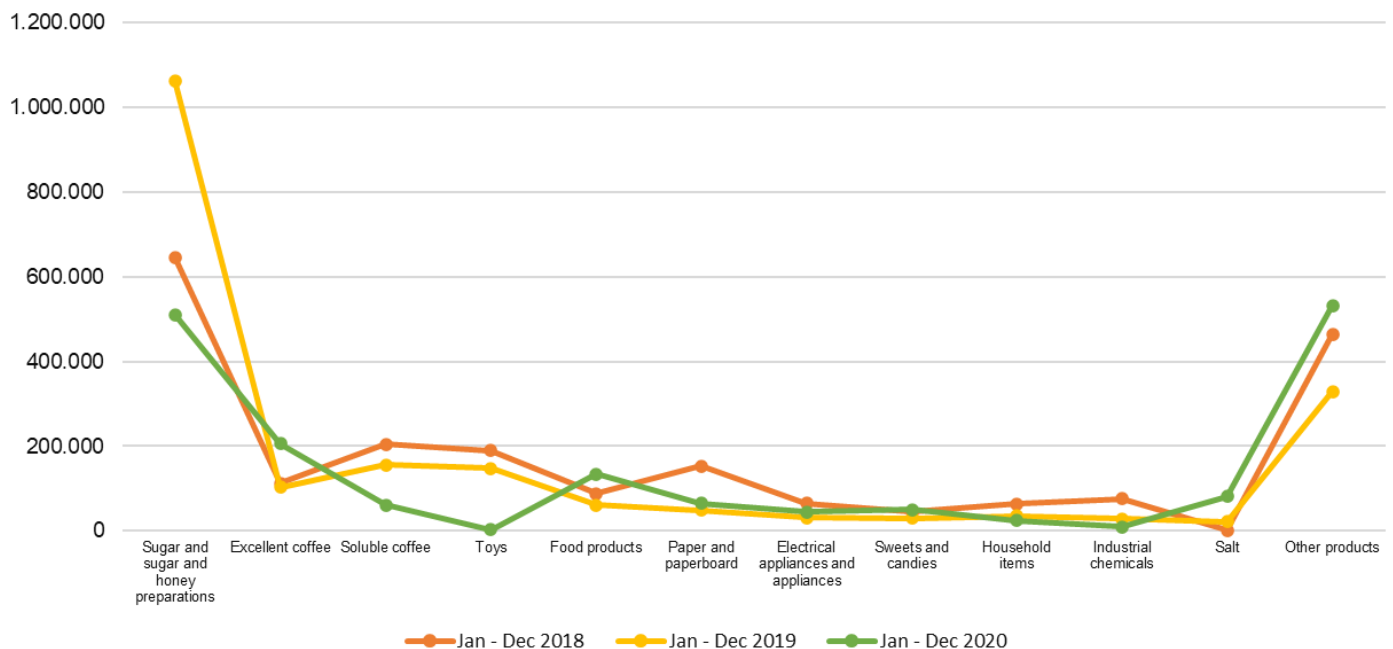

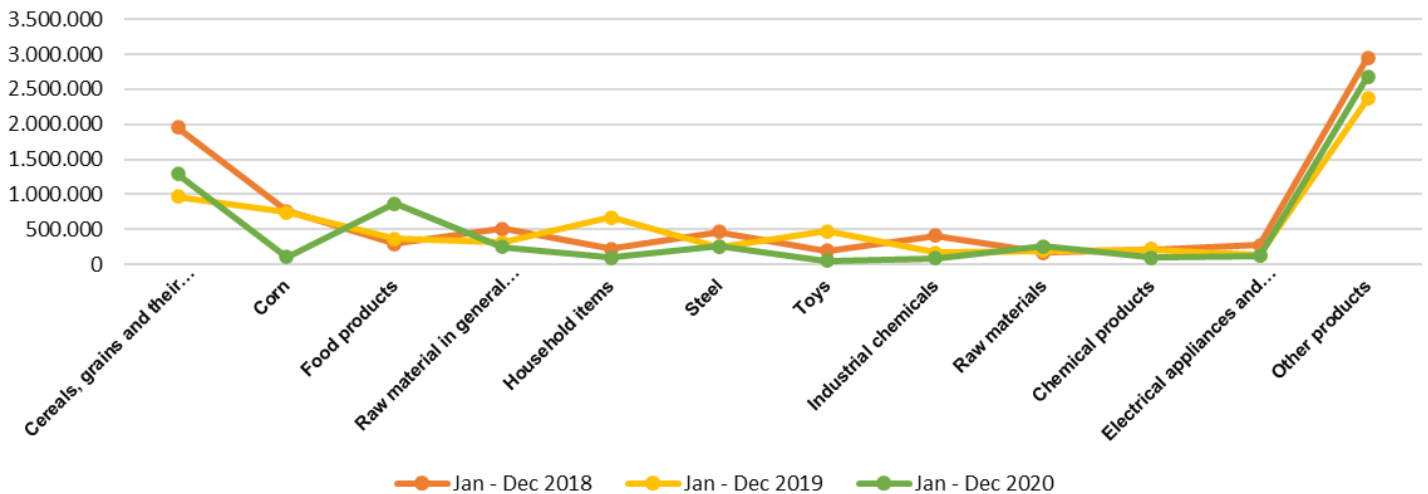

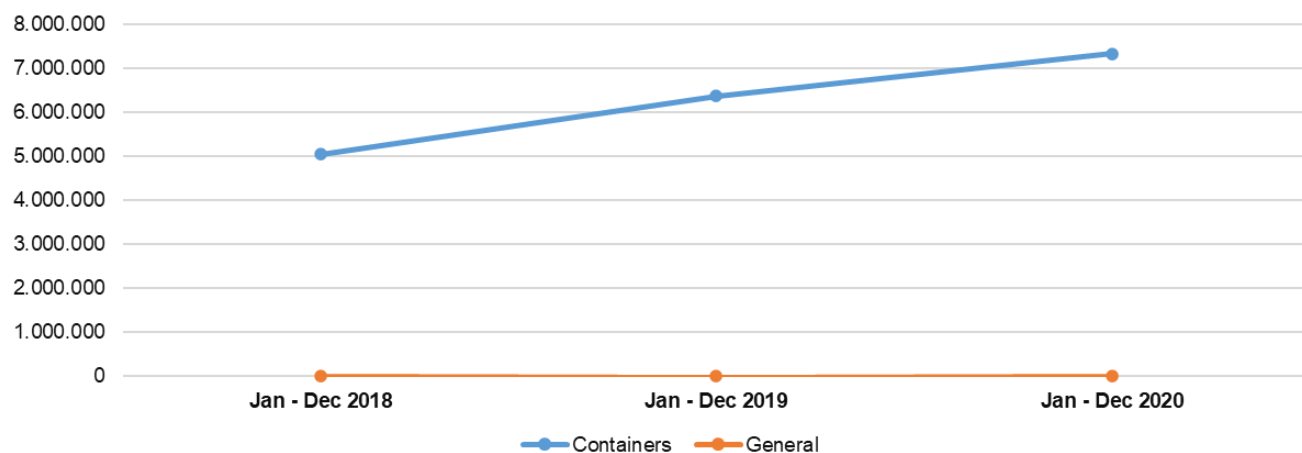

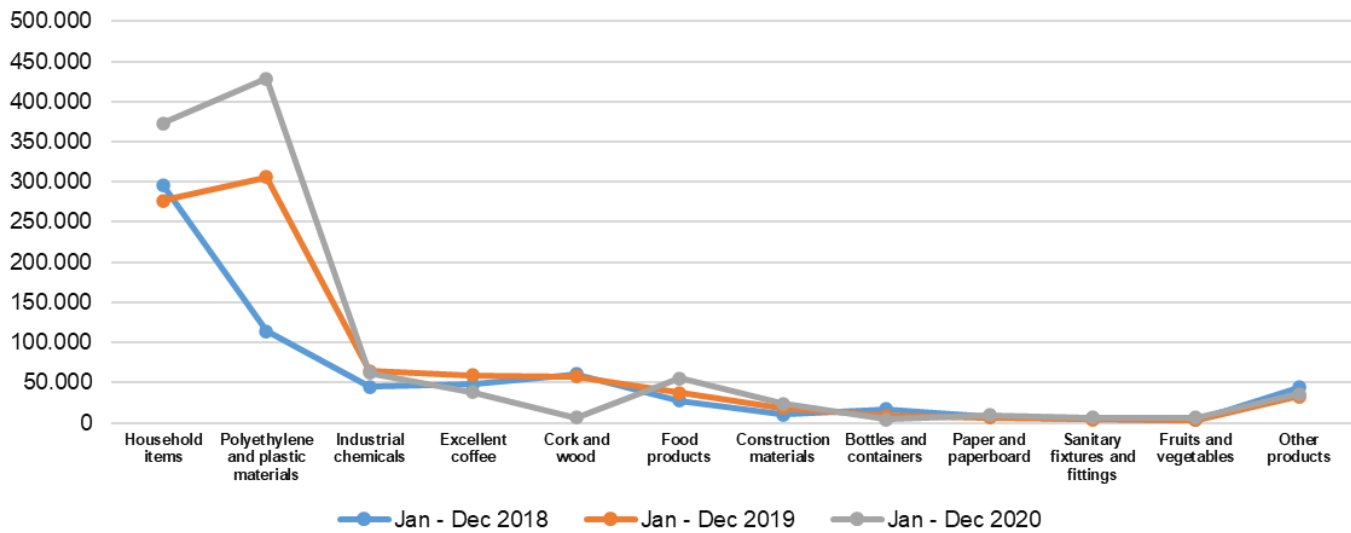

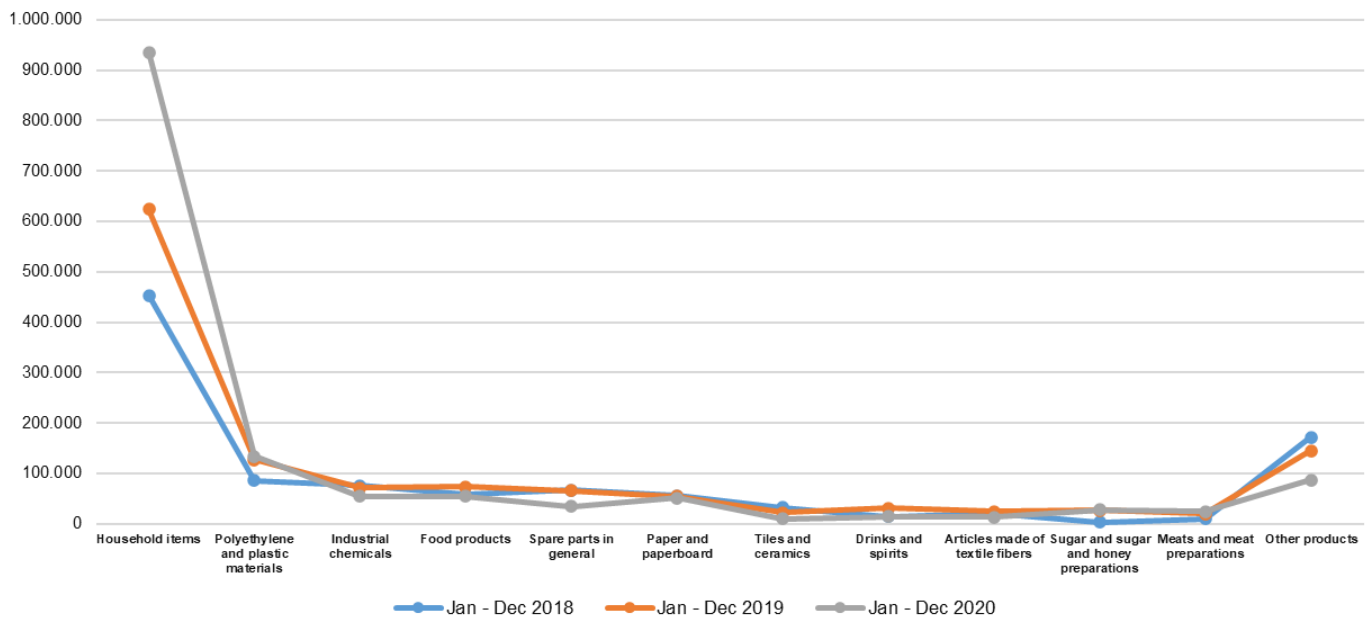

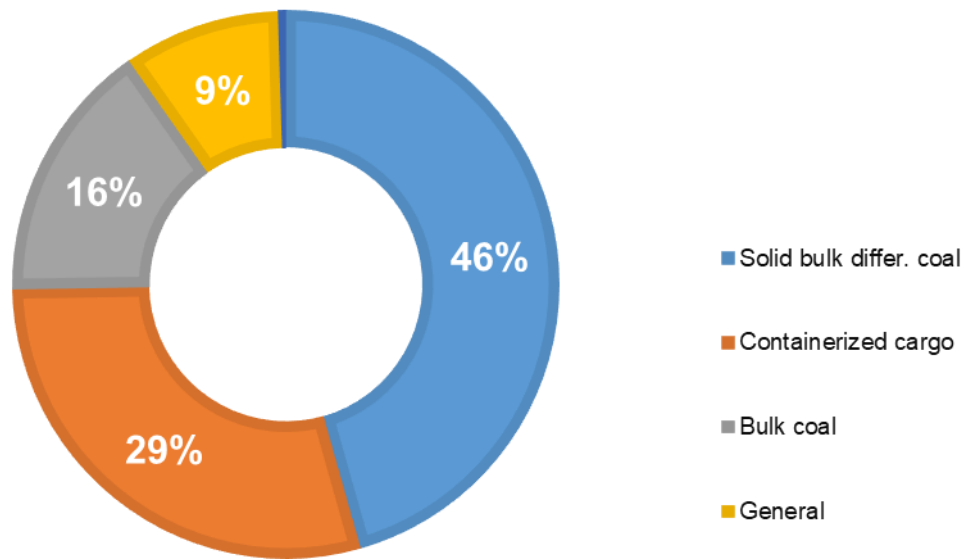

The Sociedad Portuaria Regional de Barranquilla moved 4 million tons, with a decrease of 12% (572 thousand tons less), where the type of cargo that was mostly mobilized was solid bulk other than coal, registering a participation of 45% compared to the other types of cargo. The variation of solid bulk other than coal registers a decrease of 4% compared to the previous year.

Another important type of cargo mobilized through this regional port company is containerized cargo, which had a participation of 29% and a negative variation of 16% compared to what was mobilized in the previous year, stopping mobilizing 226 thousand tons.

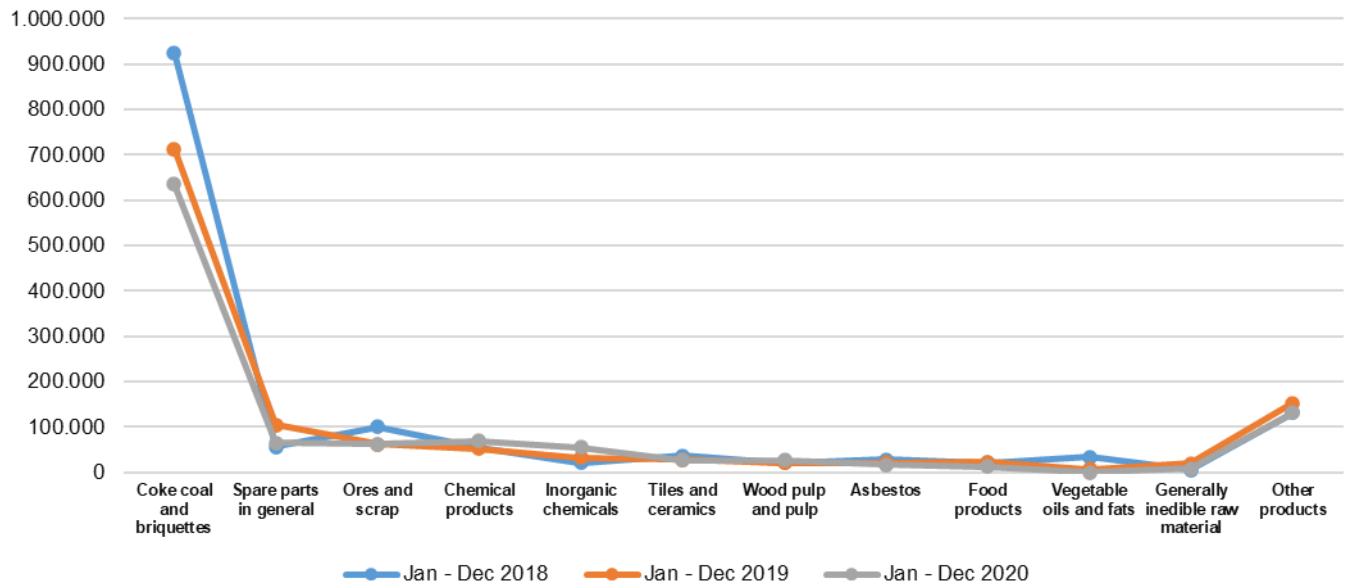

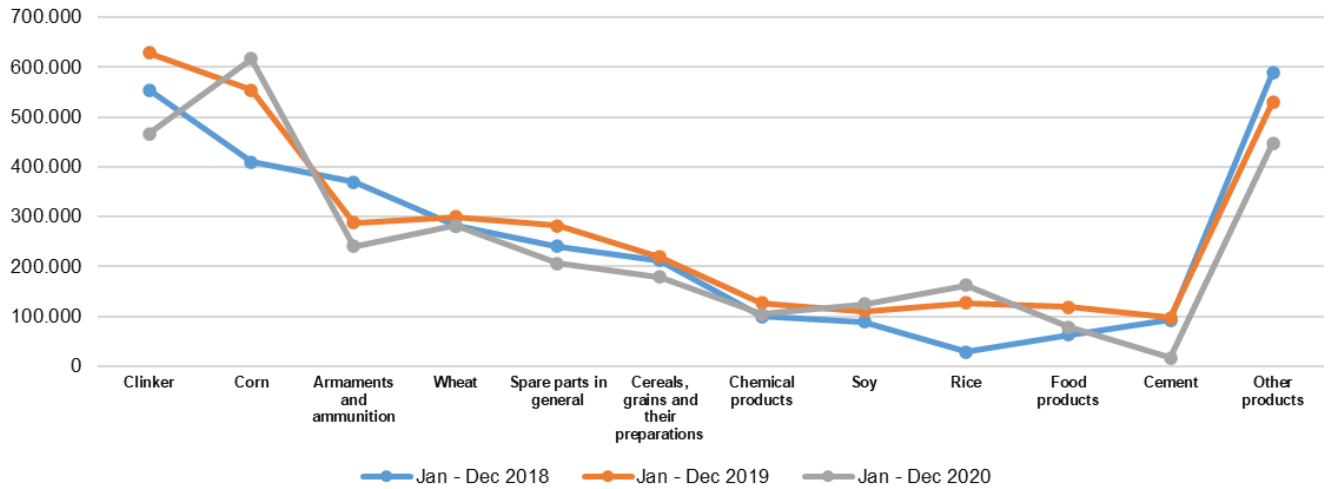

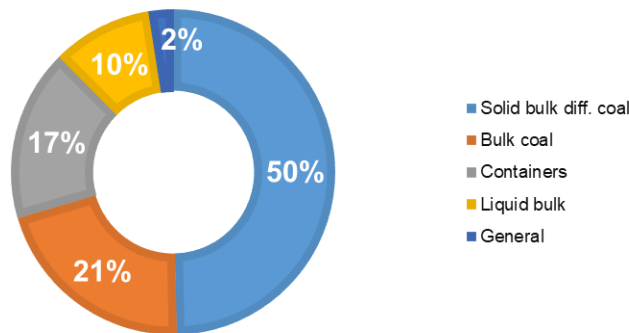

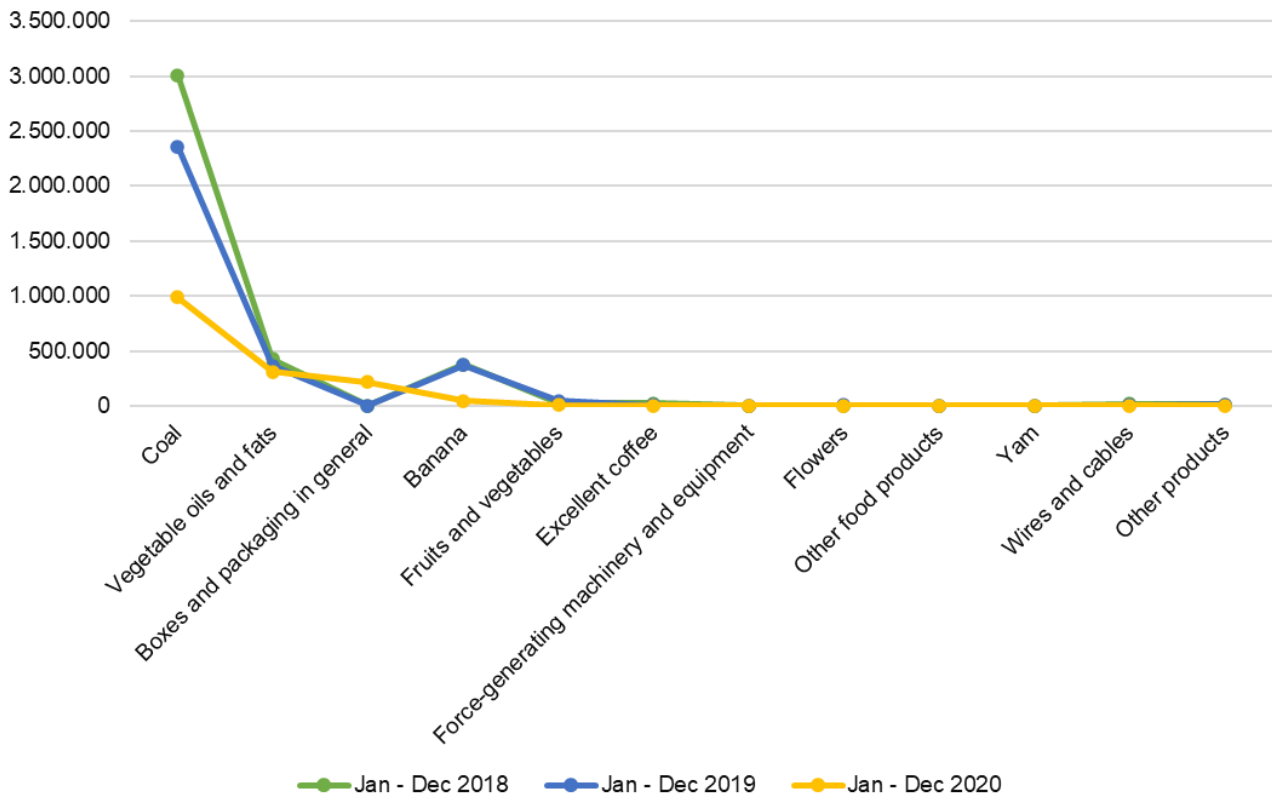

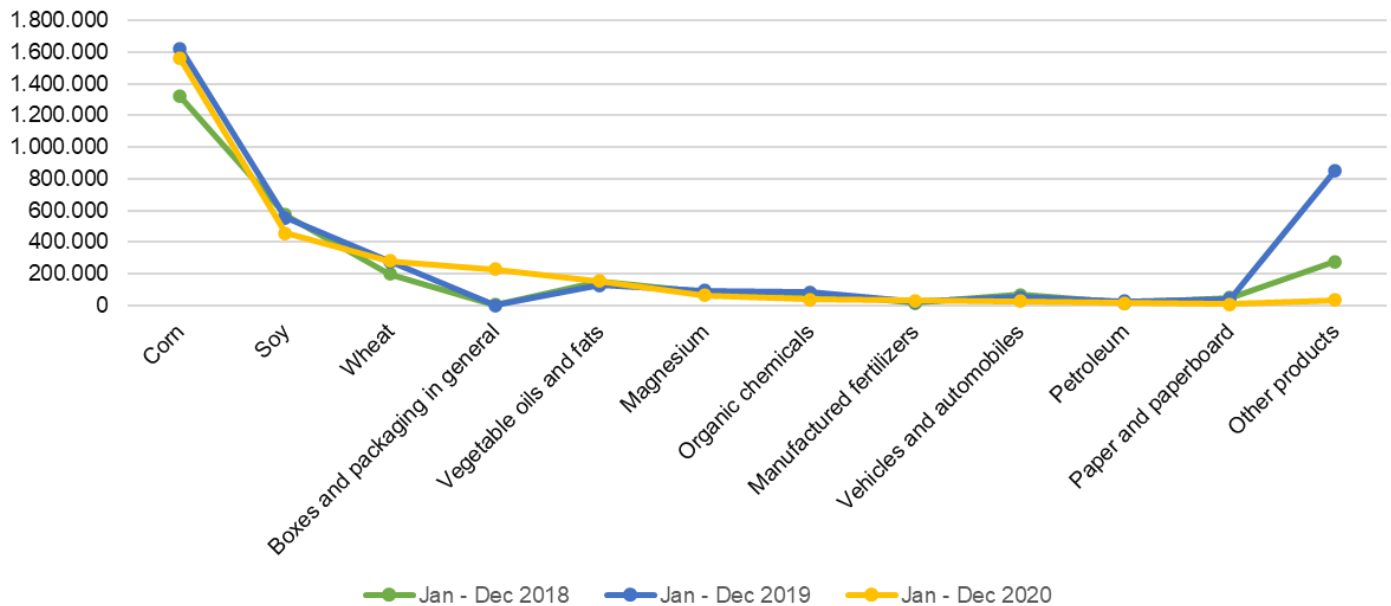

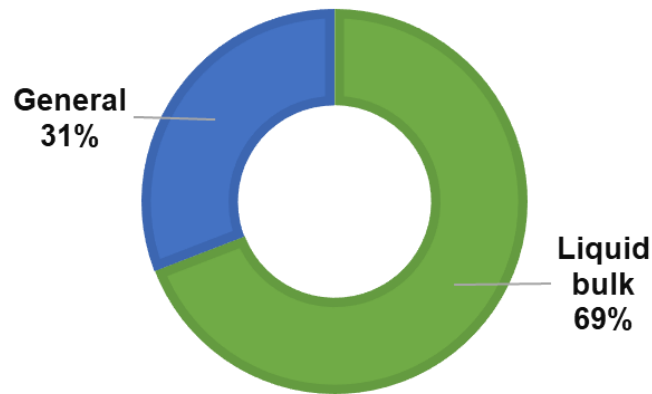

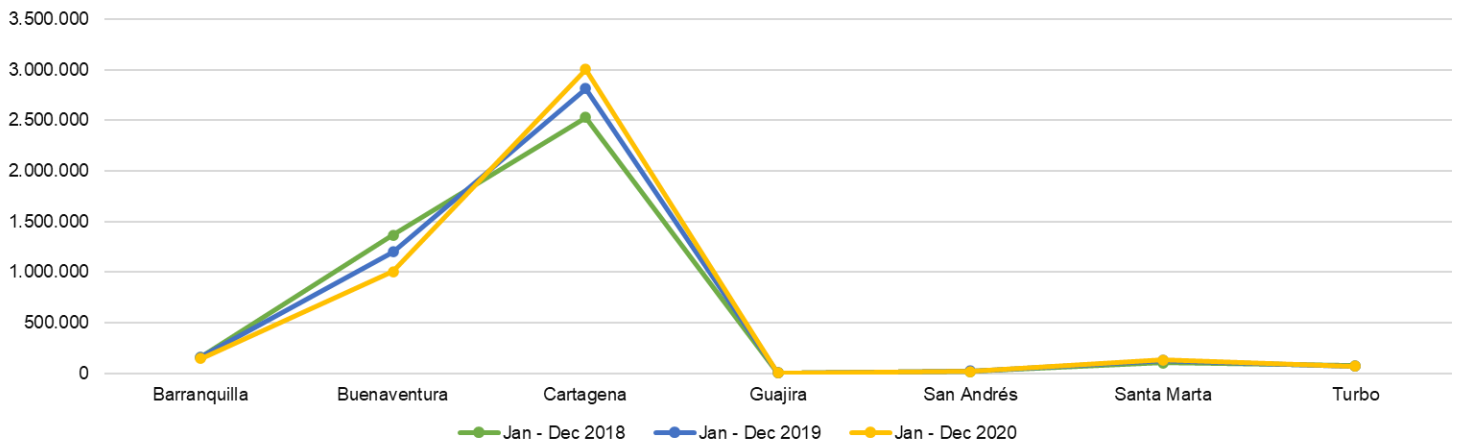

The port zones mobilized 4.3 million TEUS units in 2020, with a decrease of 0.4% in relation to the TEUS units mobilized in the previous year, which corresponds to 17 thousand less TEUS units.

The port zone of Cartagena presented the highest movement during 2020, with a participation of 68% and a growth of 6.8%, compared to the movement of TEUS registered in the previous year. The Buenaventura port zone was the second port zone with a participation of 23%, with respect to the total of TEUS mobilized, with a decrease of 16% compared to the previous year.

During 2020, the port zone of Guajira went from mobilizing a total of 2 thousand units in 2019, to mobilizing 551 TEUS units during 2020, which is equivalent to a decrease of 79%.

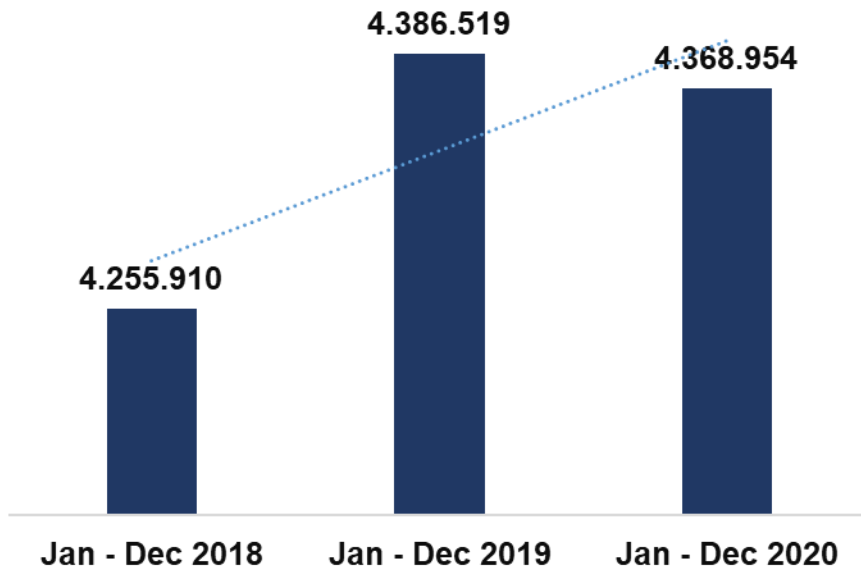

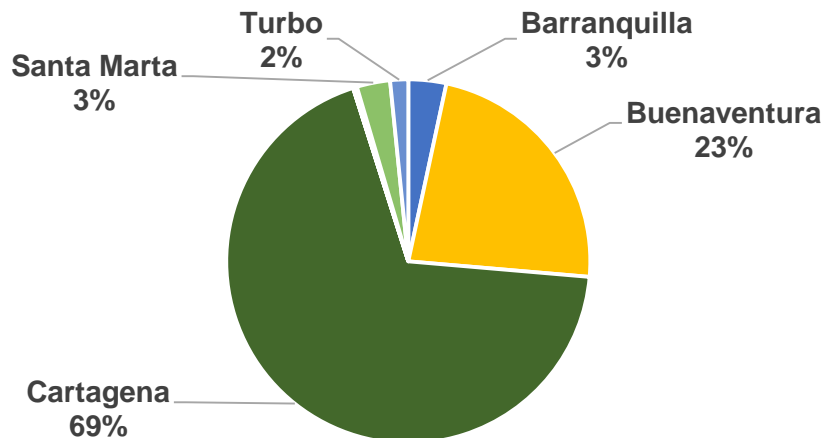

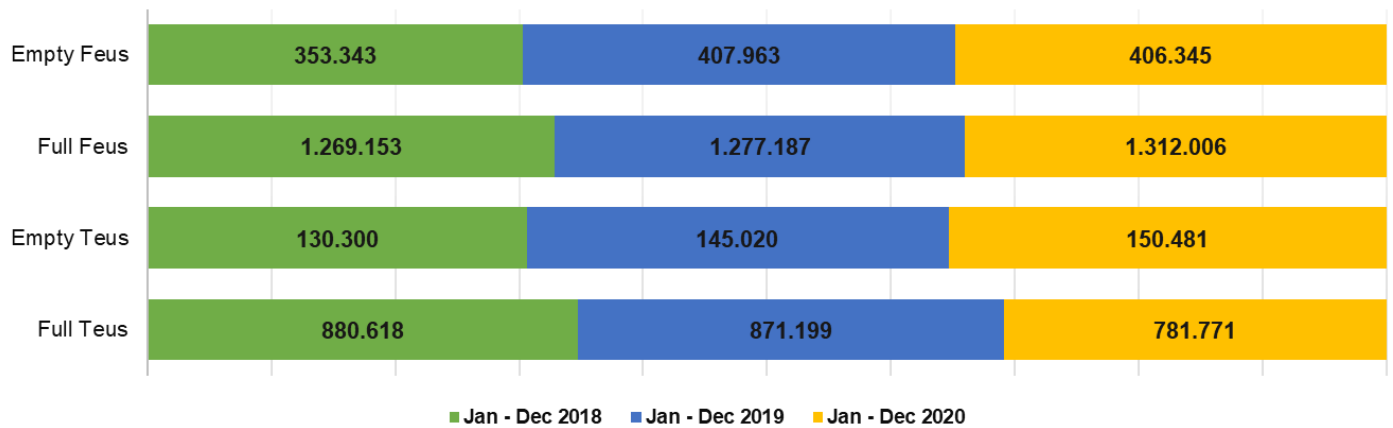

GLOSSARY

ARRIVAL: Term used to indicate the arrival or entry of ships / vessels / boats to a specific port.

SHIP: It is any floating construction destined to navigate on water. This concept includes cargo and passenger transport vessels, recreational and fishing boats, barges, sailboats, ferries, tugboats and any other type of water vehicle.

CARGO: Cargo or set of goods that for transport from one port to another are embarked and disembarked in ships/vessels/boats.

CABOTAGE CARGO: Cargo transported, embarked and unloaded between national ports

OVERLOAD CARGO: Cargo manifested as such, coming from foreign countries, for other countries or national ports, transported by sea or river.

TRANSIT CARGO: Cargo from foreign countries destined outside the country.

TRANSITORY CARGO: Cargoes that are provisionally unloaded from ships, vessels or boats, while they are in port.

FEU: The acronym FEU (in English: Forty-foot Equivalent Unit, FEU or feu), equivalent to a forty-foot unit in freight transport.

PRIVATE SERVICE PORT: It is one where services are only provided to companies legally or economically linked to the port company that owns the infrastructure

PUBLIC SERVICE PORT: It is the one where services are provided to all who are willing to submit to the rates and operating conditions.

TEU: The acronym TEU (an acronym of the term in English Twenty-foot Equivalent Unit), and means Unit Equivalent to Twenty Feet in the transport of cargo.

PORT TRAFFIC: Operations of entry, exit, docking, undocking, stay and repair of ships in port, as well as the temporary storage of said goods in the port zone.

INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION: The traffic of ships/ships/boats or aircraft, national or foreign, cargo or passengers to or from abroad.

PORT SOCIETY: They are public limited companies, constituted with private, public, or mixed capital, whose corporate purpose will be investment in construction and maintenance of ports, and their administration. Port companies provide loading and unloading services, storage in ports, and other services directly related to port activity.

SAIL: Term used with recurrence in common language to indicate both the departure of ships / vessels / boats from one place to another.



PORT ZONE: Port zone is understood to be the physical space where port operations are carried out and the Port Administrator exercises his functions, which comprises the following elements:

1. In the aquatic zone: the roadstead, the anchorage, the access channel and the dock.
2. In land space: docks, fixed or floating, ramps, monobuoys, multi-buoys, boarding platforms, cranes, yards, internal roads, warehouses and buildings used for port activities.
